Burn wound management. FACADE = First aid, Analgesia, Clean, Assess, Dress, Elevate . General burn management Limit debridement to

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wiping away clearly loose/blistered skin ;
De-roof blisters with moist gauze or
forceps and scissors if >5mm or crossing
joints.

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treatment. 2. Depth of the Burn: Burns are classified as superficial and deep dermal in clinical practice. In superficial burns, there is no or minimal dermal injury. These are first degree and superficial second degree burns, and usually heal in 3 weeks without any sequelae.

Chemical burns Immediacy of decontamination and dilution through irrigation of chemical injury is paramount as the duration of the chemical's contact with the skin is a major determinant of burn severity^{19,20}

Management of Acute Pain in Adult Burn Patients (ABA, 2020)

These guidelines include best-practice

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protocols and serve as a resource for the resuscitation of adult major burn patients in prehospital, rural, and tertiary care settings. The guidelines recognize that comprehensive major burn care requires the skills of many health professionals, including rural emergency physicians and critical care transport paramedics.

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
